The Georgia Aquarium uses a timed ticketing program, and it is recommended that advance reservations are made. Visitors can go online to georgiaaquarium.org, call ahead to 404.581.4000 or visit Aquarium ticket booths to pick the date and time of their visit. With an advance online reservation, guests will have a bar-coded e-mail sent to them. An advanced reservation guarantees admission into the Aquarium, allows guests to enjoy the Aquarium at their own pace and have room to explore.

Group rates are available for groups of 25 or more, only if you are visiting at the same time on the same day. Group rates are available daily, however some black out dates apply. 4D Theater

The 4D Theater is one of the most advanced in the world, employing interactive seats and unique special effects that are built into the theater itself. By creating a set of 4D effects that are synchronized to the film production, the 4D Theater adds another layer of immersive fun for audiences. Playing in the 4D Theater is *Deepo's Undersea 3D Wondershow* presented by AT&T. Join Deepo, an orange garibaldi fish and the Aquarium's mascot, as he takes the audience on an undersea adventure with a variety of entertaining characters, including friendly sharks, singing sea turtles and playful dolphins. The theater holds up to 250 guests per show, with multiple shows per day. Admission to the Theater is \$5.50 for adults and \$4.00 for children (age 3-12).

Parking

The official Georgia Aquarium parking deck operates 1,600 safe, secure, and well-lit spaces attached to the Georgia Aquarium. Covered and rooftop parking is available. For your convenience, you can pay for parking at the Aquarium ticket booths, member's entrance or information desk. Please remember to bring your parking ticket with you when you leave your vehicle.

Motorcoach/Bus Parking

Hourly motorcoach and school bus parking is available at the Georgia World Congress Center (GWCC) Marshalling Yard and is limited. Motorcoaches with group sales tours are required to pay \$25 per motorcoach to park at the Marshalling Yard. School buses participating in the Aquarium's education programs are allowed to park at no additional cost.

Public Transportation

The MARTA fare is \$1.75 and customers can also use unlimited weekend, weekly and monthly passes on the route. For more information please contact MARTA customer service at 404.848.5000 or visit www.itsmarta.com.

MARTA by Train:

The Georgia Aquarium is a 10-15 minute walk from either the CNN Center MARTA stop on the

East/West line or from the Peachtree Center stop on the North/South line.

MARTA by Bus:

Bus service is available to the Georgia Aquarium from the Civic Center Marta bus station and Five Points MARTA station via Route 97.

ROUTE 97 (A to Z Bus):

Go from Georgia Aquarium to Zoo Atlanta using MARTA's new A-Z bus route. Enjoy under sea and land animals all in one day!

Georgia Aquarium is connected to the Civic Center Marta bus station and the Five Points MARTA train station by bus Route 97. Route 97 runs from 5:13 a.m. until 11 p.m. Monday thru Friday and from 6:44 a.m. to 11 p.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.
